

**NEW HAMPSHIRE QUARTER HORSE ASSOCIATION  
SCHEDULE FOR YEAR END AWARDS 2010**

**-AQHA CIRCUIT-**

NHQHA will recognize the cumulative efforts of its members participating in AQHA showing by awarding end of the year awards. Awards are based on the class lists of the NHQHA AQHA shows.

**All AQHA State Affiliate and Regional Show within Region 6 will be pointed.**

Eligibility for NHQHA/AQHA Circuit Awards:

- A. All exhibitors wishing to be counted for year-end awards must be a NHQHA member in good standing.
- B. The horse owner, exhibitor/rider must be a resident of New Hampshire. Except in Open classes, only the owner must be a resident of New Hampshire. Out of State members see: Out of State Divisions and Eligibility.
- C. The horse must be registered with the American Quarter Horse Association
- D. Points will not be counted until membership and Intent to Show Forms are received by NHQHA and paid in full.
- E. All points will be accrued by the same horse/rider combination.
- F. Exhibitors must show under two (2) NHQHA judges to qualify for year-end awards
- G. Exhibitors must accumulate at least (2) points to qualify for Championship awards and at least one (1) point to qualify for a Reserve Championship in any classes shown.
- H. Points will be awarded for shows held between April 1<sup>st</sup> and September 15<sup>th</sup>.
- I. A complete show record, printed from AHQA.com, must be received by the Points Secretary by October 15<sup>th</sup>. Points will then be posted on the NHQHA website.
- J. Any discrepancies must be addressed, in writing, to the Points Secretary, within thirty days.
- K. If there is a tie for year-end awards, the Points Secretary will take the exhibitor with the highest average per class to break the tie. Example 10 points earned in 5 classes will override 10 points earned in 10 classes.
- L. If an exhibitor wishes to move up into a higher division during the same show season, the lower division points will be forfeited.

In addition to class awards;

High Point Awards will be awarded to the New Hampshire horse that has earned the highest amount of points, with a minimum of 5 points in each of the follow categories:

NHQHA Amateur Horse of the Year

NHQHA Youth Horse of the Year

NHQHA Open Horse of the Year

NHQHA Walk Trot Horse of the Year

NHQHA Grand Champion Horse

**NHQHA/AQHA CIRCUIT AWARDS – OUT OF STATE MEMBERSHIP  
YEAR END AWARDS**

Eligibility: Out of state member requirements are the same, except that New Hampshire residency is waived.

Out of State residents will be pointed for year-end awards in the following divisions.

Eight Divisions:

1. High Point Out of State Amateur
2. High Point Out of State Novice Amateur
3. High Point Out of State Amateur Select
4. High Point Out of State Open
5. High Point Out of State Novice Youth
6. High Point Out of State Youth
7. High Point Out of State Walk Trot Amateur
8. High Point Out of State Walk Trot Youth
